

ACQUIRED SCROTAL LYMPHANGIOMA MIMICKING GENITAL CONDILOMA

Summary

Genital warts rarely require a differential diagnosis with other conditions like angiokeratomas, angiofibromas or dyskeratotic dermatoses (Darier's disease, benign familial chronic pemphigus). Pseudovesicles of scrotal lymphoedema may have a keratotic appearance mimicking genital warts.

Case report – We report a patient with posttraumatic lymphoedema of inguinoscrotal region and the presence of keratotic papules like genital condyloma. Keratotic papules expressed a clear fluid spontaneously and on puncture. Histological examination revealed dilated lymphatics in the superficial dermis.

Conclusion – Scrotal lymphangioma may have a clinical appearance resembling genital condyloma requiring biopsy for the diagnosis.
